# Message from the Board President and Executive Director

Perhaps the best way to categorize 2011 is with the word "growth." PEI Kids' programs and services grew; the number of Mercer County children and families we reached grew; and our partnerships throughout the community to keep children safe and prevent child sexual abuse expanded in a very real way. Making all of this possible were our generous donors, who increased in both number and support.

Throughout 2011, PEI Kids continued to do what we do best -- provide effective and child-focused Prevention, Education and Intervention services in the areas of child sexual abuse, juvenile crime, foster care visitations, antibullying and anti-

gang efforts. Our counselors, educators and program staff helped more than 16,000 local children and their families; presented workshops in 65 Mercer County schools; and supervised more than 1,600 visits between foster children and their biological family members.

We added two new and important familycentered programs -- Creating Lasting Family Connections, which offers parents and their children on probation an opportunity to deepen their family bond, promote positive discipline and enhance personal responsibility and respect for others; and a special mother-daughter support group for child victims of sexual abuse and their mothers/female caregivers.

PEI Kids is proud to have been appointed as the lead agency for the newly formed Greater Mercer County Coalition to Prevent Child Sexual Abuse. The

> Coalition comprises community leaders who have joined together with the common goal of educating adults in Mercer County on how to recognize when a child may have been sexually abused, with a further goal of educating the adult community on how to appropriately respond

in order to keep our children safe.

We have much work to do and know that 2012 will, with your help, be one of even further growth for our agency. Together, we will continue to work toward PEI Kids' mission of promoting and maintaining a safe environment for all children.

# Three Community Leaders Join Board

# ENOUGH ABUSE CAMPAIGN New Jersey

New Jersey State Capitol in Trenton, Prevent Child Abuse-

At a December 8, 2011, press conference on the steps of the New Jersey State Capitol in Trenton, Prevent Child Abuse-New Jersey and the NJ Partnership to Prevent Child Sexual Abuse officially named PEI Kids as the lead agency of the Greater Mercer Coalition to Prevent Child Sexual Abuse.

The Greater Mercer Coalition represents all 13 municipalities in Mercer County and includes partners from the medical community, child welfare agencies, law enforcement, educators and the media. Working with three other statewide coalitions to replicate the State of Massachusetts' "Enough Abuse" campaign in New Jersey, Coalition members will work to provide every adult who lives in or works in Mercer County with the knowledge and skills they need to put an end to the silence surrounding child sexual abuse.

"The outpouring of support and commitment to this Coalition is remarkable and indicative of the fact that there is a wide commitment to stopping the horror of child sexual abuse," stated Penny Ettinger, Executive Director of PEI Kids. "Working with the State Coalition to Prevent Child Sexual Abuse, PEI Kids will lead the Greater Mercer Coalition to Prevent Child Sexual Abuse in stopping child sexual abuse, ensuring high quality services for child victims and their families, and continuing to educate children and teens on ways to protect themselves."

# An Ounce of Prevention....

As part of PEI Kids' efforts with the Greater Mercer Coalition to Prevent Child Sexual Abuse, we will be sharing Prevention Tips from the ENOUGH ABUSE Campaign throughout the community. Please share them with others.



# Prevention Tip: Stay Alert for Possible Behavioral Signs of Abusers

People who sexually abuse children are often described as nice and likeable, and may be experts at gaining your confidence. They often "groom" a child or family over time, allowing them to build trust and gain access to their target. They sometimes choose work that gives them "cover" at schools, youth groups, sports teams and other places where children live and play. There is no foolproof checklist of behaviors to help you definitely spot a potential child sexual abuser. However, the following behaviors have been identified as warning signs or an indication that you may need to begin asking some questions.

# Have you seen these behavioral signs in adults who interact with your children?

- Doesn't appear to have a regular number of adult friends and prefers to spend free time interacting with children and teenagers who are not his/her own;
- Finds ways to be alone with a child when adults are not likely to interrupt, e.g.
  taking the child for a car ride, arranging a trip, or frequently offering to baby
  sit etc.
- Ignores a child's verbal or physical cues that he or she does not want to be hugged, kissed, or tickled;
- Seems to have a different special child or teen friend of a particular age or appearance from year to year;

- Doesn't respect a child's or teen's privacy in the bathroom or bedroom;
- Gives a child or teen money or gifts for no particular occasion;
- Discusses or asks a child or teen to discuss sexual experiences or feelings;
- Views child pornography through tapes, photographs, magazines or the Internet.
   (In addition to being an important behavioral sign, possessing, viewing and/or selling child pornography is a criminal offense and should be reported.)

Be careful and slow in choosing whom you allow into your family's circle of trust and carefully consider placing your child with an adult in an unsupervised situation. For more information, call PEI Kids at 609-695-3739.




